### SOCIETY NEWS VIEWING SOCIETY BOARD MEETINGS SUMMARY OF PORTIONS OF THE MAY 17

SOCIETY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Compiled by Deica Ruiz

Meeting commenced at 1:30 pm

### Motions:

- To approve Veolia Agreement allowing HH residents to continue to use the Garden Area motion passed.
- To approve Veolia Agreement to allow Veolia to utilize a small space at HH Maintenance Yard for debris motion passed.
- To approve Purchaser's Contribution Policy as written motion passed.

Board members in attendance: Gloria Anderson, Gene Archer, Annette Bensen, Bill Harden, Dorinda Haskel, Jack Mattes, Karl Milde, Patricia Ploss, Dom Rubino, Deica Ruiz, Art Singer, Alan Tepper, Jay Wright. Ann Harper and Bruce Prince were absent. John Milligan and Dave Jacobsen were also in attendance.

### Willow Wood Gun Club - Gloria Anderson, 2nd VP

The WWGC has applied to the Carmel Planning Board to install additional shooting stations. At a public meeting regarding this application, HH residents expressed reservations and objections concerning increased noise and potential water pollution. According to the Secretary to the Planning Board, the Carmel Planning Board will approve the application at its May 24, 2023 meeting.

#### Financial Report – Bill Harden, Treasurer

- April income was \$463,286 and expenses were \$422,055, leaving a surplus of \$41,231. The first 4-5 months of the year are when we build a surplus. Pool season, June, July, and August are when we run deficits, and major projects happen toward the end of the year.
- At the end of the year, we will be able to pay back our savings account the funds that were borrowed to balance this year's budget.

#### Communications/Website/Newsletter – Annette Bensen, Chair

• Updating of our website is in progress, we are requesting that Clubs and Condos continue to submit updated contact information to the Activities office.

#### Fitness Center – Annette Bensen, Chair

- Preventative maintenance and a thorough cleansing has been performed throughout the facility.
- Appointments for introduction to the equipment are still active, please see staff for an appointment.

### Activities Committee – Dorinda Haskel, Co-Chair

• We continue to request updated contact information from our Clubs and Activities groups. Please submit forms to the Activities office.

### Digital Records Retention - Jay Wright, Committee Chair

- Society's historical records are under a review process to transfer over to a digital format. Our committee is auditing and renaming each file of approximately 27 boxes for proper storing.
- We plan to finalize the contract with a vendor who will do the digitization.

### Resident ID Card System Committee – Gene Archer and Dorinda Haskel, Co-Chairs

- The resident ID card system we now use is outdated, and we look forward to updating it with a new version.
- We are in the process of gathering information and vetting companies to see who can best provide us a new card system. The new ID cards will be phased in slowly, as we phase out the old.
- We have budgeted money for this large project.

### Ad-Hoc Committee / Alternate Energy Committee – Energy Sources for Society facilities – John Milligan:

We are exploring alternate energy sources for Society facilities in the form of solar panels and, specifically for Lake Lodge, a geothermal or hydrothermal system. As more information becomes available, we will provide more details.

### Audit Committee – Jack Mattes, Chair:

• Our Financial Audit is currently in progress and our CPA has provided us with a draft. We are working with their office and provide information as they request it. We are ahead of last year's schedule.

### Society Board Elections – Alan Tepper, Committee Chair

- The application deadline to run for a seat on the Society Board of Directors was originally April 24, 2023, and was extended to May 1st. No new applications were received, therefore ballots will not be mailed and we will not have a candidates' night.
- At the June 21st Annual Meeting, our incumbents, all five of whom are running for re-election, will be elected by acclimation and their terms will be effective July 1st.
- We welcome residents to consider becoming involved and are hoping for some new interest next year.

### Meadowlark Park – Patricia Ploss, Chair

- Marti Lowenfeld of our committee is working with beekeeper Thom Mittag to arrange one or two talks about bees. Details to follow.
- The fountain has been installed and the electrical meter at the south end of Meadow Pond is screened.
- At Park Place the pachysandra is out, and grass seed is in; Park Place signs are up, and the awning has been installed.

### Landscaping – Patricia Ploss, Chair

- Pretty blue pots are in place at Lake Lodge and at the three-way stop; summer flowers have been planted.
- Evergreens have been planted at the Activities Center to screen the new generator.
- Plans are in place to enlarge the planting circle around the Meadowlark Park sign.

### Community Affairs Committee – Jack Mattes, Chair

- The smoke alarm program with the American Red Cross is still active. Please contact the Activities office or the Red Cross directly (845) 673-1198 for an appointment.
- In addition, the Town is communicating with the Somers community regarding the smoke alarm program, with a PSA and an article in the Somers Record. There is a link on the Town website for appointments.
- The primary election to be held in the Heritage Room in June has been cancelled.

### • Town News:

- Construction of a commercial storage unit facility is planned on Route 100. Current plans show a 2-story building with a residential façade and limited parking.
- The Tractor Supply store that is replacing the old Home Goods will soon have new signage.
- A proposal for construction of condominiums at the intersection of Mahopac Avenue, specifically in area by Tool Nut, has been submitted to the Town Planning Board.

### Library – Deica Ruiz, Chair

- For the month of June, we are adding 13 new books, including ones by Danielle Steel, Susan Isaacs, and Jo Nesbo.

### Health & Safety – Flo Brodley, Chair

- This year's first holistic program, Beauty and the Beast, on environmental estrogens and their effects on the body went extremely well and I was glad to see a few hardy male souls in the audience!
- Speakers on holistic topics offer a vision different from mainstream medicine (even though they may be regular M.D.s). The aim of these programs is to bring information forward that present new perspectives to common issues. It took many decades for chiropractic services and the benefits of vitamins to be accepted by the mainstream medical community and so may these topics we present today. We hope you'll attend these programs with an open mind to learn new ways of addressing established procedures.

- Blood pressure screenings will continue on the second Friday of each month by Nurse Ellie Eidam who always reminds us that you may bring your blood pressure machine with you for a quick checkup.
- As always, we encourage residents with health and safety backgrounds to contact me at *flo613@comcast.net* with their resume, if they wish to join our committee.

### Security – Dave Jacobsen, Prosegur Supervisor

- April stats: 53 security calls, 67 medical calls, 1 car accident with injuries, 50 service calls, 4 parking violations, 11 maintenance calls including 1 water main break, 8 fire alarms for a total of 194 for the month, year to date 721. Calls to the Security office should be for security, medical and safety related emergencies only.
- When to call 911 If you have a Police, Fire Dept or EMS emergency, your first call should be to 911. These dispatchers can map your call to your address in case of a lost call. Our security office does not have the capability to map your call to your location. Our office monitors all 911 calls and will be present as well for those emergency calls.

### Operations Report – John Milligan, Property Manager

In earlier Board meetings we have highlighted expenses for insurance and for utilities. This month we are focusing on four of the largest budget categories. The Society budget is roughly \$6 million dollars a year, with 98-99% coming from Society fees.

- The costliest single budget item is the contract with Prosegur (Security and EMS) at \$1.2 million dollars per year.
- The second most costly budget category is salaries for the 19 Society employees, at \$907,000 annually.
- Third is the landscaping and snow removal contract with Westchester Properties Group, at \$770,000 annually.
- The fourth category is our pools at nearly \$400,000 per year to operate our 5 pools with a pool season of a little over 100 days. Much more is spent on pools alone than on paving, insurance, or utilities. Pool costs include lifeguard salaries, pool chemicals, electricity, propane, pool supplies, and repairs.

These four items alone represent over  $3 \ \mbox{million}$  dollars, half of our entire yearly budget.

### Pools

- All 5 pools will soon be open 7 days a week, 10 hours a day. Last year, lifeguards cost us \$180,000; this year we will also have a gate attendant on weekends.
- Pool 4 received temporary repairs to get us through this season. An engineering firm has begun work on developing a repair strategy for Pool 4 which has consistently been leaking water.
- Furniture and cabanas are ready for use and adjusting the pool temperature is a work in progress with these very cool mornings.

#### Tennis

- Several seams on Court #1 have come loose and will be addressed. Oval Tennis has determined a repair strategy, which will be scheduled as soon as possible. In the meantime Court #1 is unavailable for play.
- The platform tennis courts have been repainted and look beautiful. The old halogen lights, several of which were not functional, have been replaced with new LED fixtures. LED lights are much brighter, last longer, and consume less electricity, lowering our energy costs.

#### **Activities Parking**

- All parking spaces on the island closest to the bocce and pickleball courts will be converted to handicapped parking spaces this summer.
- Parking in the rear of the Activities and Fitness Centers is not allowed. There are signs that indicate it is limited to service vehicles only, specifically our landscape, security, and maintenance staff vehicles. It is also used for deliveries of our oil, propane, and pool chemicals. There is also a Fire Dept. hookup at the rear of the Fitness Center. Please do not park in this area.

### NYSEG/Veolia

- NYSEG is nearly finished with their multi-year, multi-million dollar infrastructure project in HH. They have done extensive reseeding, including topsoil, throughout several condo areas where they completed work last fall, and restoration work in roadways, driveways, and lawn areas. If they haven't been in your condo, it means that you already have jacketed underground wiring in conduit that does not need to be replaced.
- Water main breaks and/or repairs: Repairs to water mains require digging 9 feet deep to inspect the issue and it can be difficult to predict exactly when water will be cut off and for what duration. Neither Society nor Security receive advance notice of repairs, nor do they receive updates as the work progresses. Calls to our Security office about these disruptions can prevent important calls from being answered. If there is no water, call the water company; if there is no power, call NYSEG. You are more likely to receive accurate information that way.

#### **Fitness Center**

• We are expecting delivery of three new pieces of equipment, installation of an operable window near the treadmills and replacement of the roof mounted AC units. A new massage table has arrived and is in place. The new pieces of equipment are a Hoist HD-3900 Pec Fly/Rear Deltoid Machine, an Octane XR6000 Seated Elliptical w/standard console, and a True Upright Bike w/Envision console.

### **Meadowlark Park**

• Sometime after Memorial Day we will begin work to complete an extension of the Warren Street trail. When the Warren Street trail is extended, we intend to address the rather lumpy condition of the trail leading towards Warren Street, near the playground. As a reminder, dogs should be leashed and look for doggie stations for clean-up.

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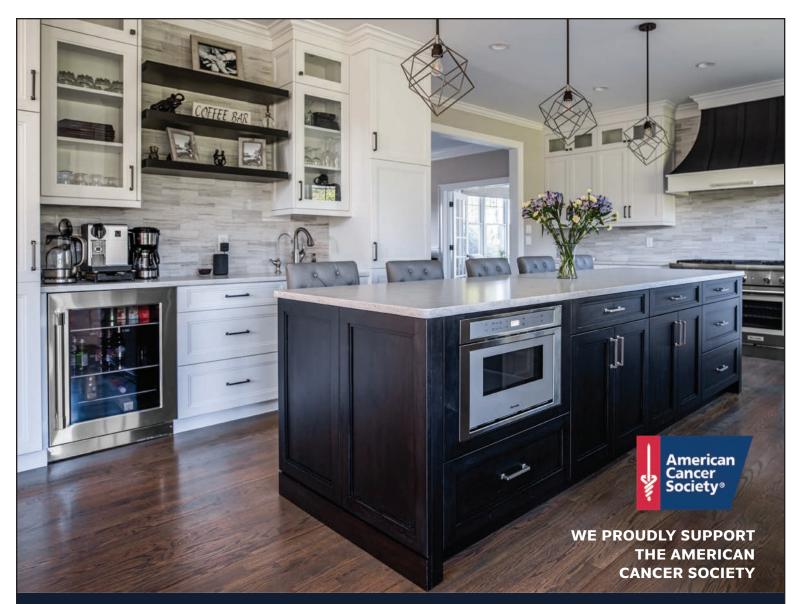
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### **COUNCIL OF CONDOS**

By Terry Clifford

The May 17 meeting was attended by Condos 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, 15, 16, 17, 19, 20, 24, 25, 26, 27, 18, and 30.

Somers Town Supervisor, Robert Scorrano gave a "State of the town Report".

- 1% increase in tax rolls.
- Encourage State Police to remain in Somers. Somers currently has a part-time police force which allows the Town to save a great deal of money. Somers will acquire land near the current State Police Headquarters to have New York State build a larger State police headquarters. The final decision will depend on the New York State Budget.
- The PepsiCo Building on Route 35 is 30% occupied. The IBM building along Route 100 has been vacant for 8 years.
- The Town is planning to provide a pedestrian path at the Heritage Hills traffic light to allow safe crossing to enter the strip mall on the Heritage Hills side of the road.
- There are plans to provide some improvements to Bailey Park.
- Plans to build a 75 unit building on land located at the Baldwin Place Shopping Centre. This project will include a 5,000 square foot community recreation center with volleyball, pickle ball, as well as a dog park. Tractor Supply is moving into the vacant Home Goods space.
- Further development is proposed on Route 6 near the Tool Nut side of Mahopac Avenue. The developer will remove the abandoned Old Angle Fly development.
- Lake Lincolndale shopping center asked for rezoning for one acre behind the existing plaza at Lovell Street and Route 202 to build a two-story building using the shopping center parking so no additional parking is necessary. Sidewalks may be added to the area.
- A proposal to build a high-end storage building along Route 100 on the property near Froggies Deli.

- Mr. Scorrano indicated the Willow Wood Gun Club expansion impacts both Heritage Hills and Somers Town property. Water and soil samples were taken and tested by an independent lab. The samples tested positive for lead. Somers is addressing these issues with Carmel's planning board. This issue will take a while to resolve.
- Speeding in the Town of Somers has increased. Most of our roads are State owned. However, local roads may be getting stop signs.

*Council Treasurer*—Doris Simon was unanimously voted in as Treasurer due to the resignation of Dorinda Haskell.

*Condo Communications* –Our 30 condos have a variety of ways of communicating with their unit owners. Attending Board Meetings, Newsletters, attending a Board Meeting but leaving the meeting when their issue has been heard, and Board Meetings without attendees. One Condo mentioned Cluster Captains receive approved meeting minutes and welcome new unit owners.

*Council Vendor Directory* – A discussion took place about the usefulness and accuracy of the Directory and if it should be continued. Further discussion will take place at the June meeting.

We look forward to having all Condos representatives at the 7 pm, Wednesday, July 19 meeting at in the Activities Center Heritage Room.

The Culinary Club recently went to Savor Restaurant for a cooking demonstration and lunch.

The chef, Rick, showed us how he prepared stuffed pork loin.

The stuffing was baby spinach, garlic, fontina and grated Romano cheeses (lots of cheese).

Using a large knife, he cut a slit about 1/3 of the way up from the bottom of the roast along the long side. He flattened it out, and continued the slit about halfway up. He flattened the meat out, creating a rectangle of meat, about 1" thick.

He pounded it a bit to make it a little thinner, making the whole roast an even thickness. He spread the spinach filling evenly across the meat, the proceeded to roll it up like a jelly roll.

He used butcher's twine to hold it closed, pushing whatever stuffing fell out back in. He then roasted it until done.

I could see doing this with a beef roast, too, maybe adding more spices to the stuffing as beef has a stronger flavor than pork.

The stuffed pork loin was delicious, and the stuffing was soooo creamy and garlicky. Try it, you may create a new special occasion dinner!

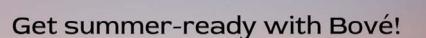
