SUMMARY OF PORTIONS OF THE APRIL 19 SOCIETY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Compiled by Deica Ruiz

Meeting commenced at 1:30 pm

Motions:

- To approve renewal of our insurance policy package with Gerelli Insurance for 2023/2024 – motion passed.
- To approve revised shuttle bus schedule, eliminating the 2:45 pm and 3:45 pm midday runs motion passed.
- To approve the purchase of three new pieces of fitness equipment and the purchase of an operable window for the Fitness Center – motion passed.

Board members in attendance: Gloria Anderson, Gene Archer, Annette Bensen, Bill Harden, Ann Harper, Dorinda Haskel, Jack Mattes, Karl Milde, Patricia Ploss, Dom Rubino, Deica Ruiz, Art Singer, Alan Tepper, Jay Wright. Bruce Prince was absent. John Milligan and Dave Jacobsen were also in attendance.

Bylaw Amendment - Alan Tepper, Committee Chair:

 The results of the ballot vote on the Purchaser's Contribution Bylaw Amendment are as follows. Votes for approval — 894, votes for disapproval — 459, invalid ballots — 85. The amendment was approved.

Gloria Anderson, 2nd Vice President:

• Once the bylaw passed, the Board of Directors agreed to adopt a policy to interpret the bylaw amendment for our community. The policy states that, effective July 1, 2023, the initial amount of the contribution is \$1,500, regardless of the size or model of the unit being purchased. The amount of the contribution will be reviewed annually in conjunction with the Board's annual budget review process and may be adjusted or increased based on budgetary considerations, at the Board's discretion.

Financial Report – Bill Harden, Treasurer:

 March income was \$522,722 and expenses were \$394,263. Keep in mind that the first 4-5 months of the year are when we develop a surplus. By the end of the year, we will be able to pay back our savings account the funds that were borrowed to balance this year's budget.

Insurance Report - Bill Harden, Treasurer

- We are renewing our insurance policy with Gerelli Insurance for the year 2023/24; there is a 13% increase in premiums this year; we had budgeted a 9% increase. The premium of the new liability package policy is \$81,044.
- In addition to liability, we have other insurance policies; these include Directors and Officers policy at \$5,639, crime policy at \$1,518.75, cyber liability policy is \$1,054, and volunteer accident policy is \$300.
- Mr. Harden made a motion to approve the new insurance policy, which includes an umbrella policy of \$15 milllion. Ms. Ploss voted no for the umbrella reduction, yes for removal of flood and earthquake coverage; the motion passed.

Communications/Website/Newsletter - Annette Bensen, Chair:

- In keeping our website updated, we are requesting that Clubs and Condos submit updated contact information to the Activities office.
- **Newsletter**: The May issue is on schedule with information on Activities, Classes, and Clubs.

Welcome to HH Committee – Dorinda Haskel, Co-Chair:

This year's event is scheduled for Saturday, September 9, 2023.
 New and old residents are welcome to attend.

Society Board Elections - Alan Tepper. Committee Chair:

- On a yearly basis, the Society Board has five (5) seats that are up for re-election.
- We've received a response from our incumbents, all of whom are running for re-election.
- We welcome and encourage residents to consider becoming involved.

Digital Records Retention - Jay Wright, Committee Chair:

- Society's historical records, files that we are to "retain permanently," are under a review process to transfer over to a digital format.
- We anticipate the auditing process will take 3 months to complete.

Meadowlark Park - Patricia Ploss. Chair:

• **Trails**: This month our landscaper will determine the measurements and costs for the extension of one of our trails.

 Park Place: You can now find board games at Park Place. Joe Rocha and Marcus Lovell have built a terrific bookcase for storage of children's books and games. We are happy to accept donations.

Landscaping:

 Our generator located outside of the AC will be receiving shrubbery to screen it from view.

Community Affairs Committee – Jack Mattes, Chair:

- The April 4, Food Drive was a success thanks to our wonderful HH community. The Somers Food Pantry received over 80 bags of donated items and over \$1,000 in monetary donations.
- There is a school board election on May 16 and there are four (4) candidates running to fill two (2) open positions.
- The primary election will take place on June 27 here in the HR.

Emergency Preparedness Committee – Jack Mattes, Chair:

 The smoke alarm program with the American Red Cross is still active. Please contact the Activities office or The Red Cross directly (845) 673-1198 for an appointment.

Library - Deica Ruiz, Chair:

- For the month of May we are adding 16 new books, including titles by David Baldacci, Walter Mosley, and John Sandford.
- Please remember the library is now open from 10 am to 3 pm, Monday through Friday, thanks to our wonderful volunteers. You may call us at 914-276-7655 to reserve a book and leave the name of the book and your contact information. The full list of books can be found at *hhsociety.org*, under the library tab.

Pool Committee - Joan Sotille:

- We are currently in the process of pool sticker distribution.
- Guest policy changes have been submitted to the Society Board, please keep a look out for any updates.
- Water Aerobics classes will be held Monday through Friday at 9 am at pool 4 during July and August.
- Residents must present their ID with a 2023 pool sticker to gain entrance. Junior ID card holders will also require a pool sticker.

Security - Dave Jacobsen, Prosegur Supervisor:

- March stats: 26 security calls, 55 medical calls, 9 fire alarms/CO detectors, 44 service calls, 15 maintenance emergencies, 3 parking violations, 1 car accident; a total of 154 for the month, year to date 528. Calls to the Security office should be for security, medical and safety related emergencies only.
- We had two fires this month, one fire occurred at the stove, please do not walk away while using your stove. The second fire was in the kitchen garbage can due to a lit cigarette.
- The water main break that occurred on Easter overwhelmed the Security phone lines with over 200 calls preventing any emergency calls from getting through. We have one dispatcher in the office.
 Please contact Veolia directly when experiencing a water main break.
- When to call 911 If you have a Police, Fire Dept or EMS emergency, your first call should be to 911.

Operations Report – John Milligan, Property Manager:

Expenses Discussion

- 2022 utilities expenditures, totaling \$290,000:
 - NYSEG: 78 invoices monthly totaling \$115,000, of which \$39,000 is streetlights. Using LED lights does help with costs and has been installed throughout Society's buildings, pools, and equipment
 - → Heating oil \$76,000
 - Veolia Water and Sewer \$36,000
 - Communication (Comcast/Verizon/Verizon Wireless) \$34,000
 - Propane \$28,000.

• Building related expenditures:

- O Activities Center \$80,000
- Fitness Center \$43,000
- Lake Lodge \$36,000
- Maintenance Yard \$22,000
- Park Place \$9,500
- Pools \$56,000 (utility expenditures)

Shuttle Buses

• The Board has decided to condense midday bus service to 6 runs, eliminating the 2:45 pm and 3:45 pm midday runs effective May 1.

NYSEG

• NYSEG has already begun their final infrastructure replacement work on Condos 18 and 23 which are almost complete.

Pools

 Pool #4 has a structure issue and is leaking. The pool has been drained and walls will be sealed to minimize leakage for this pool season. At some time in the future Pool #4 will have to be closed for much of, if not all of the pool season for major structural repair.

Tennis

 The initial reconditioning of our 4 turf courts is scheduled for the week of May 1. The lights at the platform tennis courts are very old and need to be replaced.

Fitness Center

• The Fitness Center Committee has made recommendations to purchase three machines and recommended installing an operable window to introduce fresh air. These total \$17,488, within the \$20,000 allocated in the 2023 budget.

Miscellaneous

 The honeybees have arrived via the U.S. Postal Service and have been installed in the hive, and a 12 volt fence has been installed to keep away the bears. A couple of education sessions concerning the importance of honeybees to our environment may be held.

COUNCIL OF CONDOS

By Terry Clifford

The April 19 meeting was attended by Condos 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, 13, 15, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 23, 25, 27, 28, and 30.

Guest speaker – Jason Schiciano, President of Levitt-Fiurst Insurance spoke about what should be included in a "Variance" package required when unit owners hire a contractor or other vendor to complete work in their unit. He distributed sample Unit Owners Indemnification and Insurance Agreement forms, Contractor's Indemnification agreement, and Certificate of Liability Insurance. These agreements protect the unit owner and the Condo from litigation in the event the contractor's workers injure themselves. The New York State Scaffold Law allows workers to find the Condo and unit at fault in the event of an on-the-job accident. Therefore, adding the sample documents to the Variance provides litigation protection for the Condo.

If a contractor has poor insurance Jason recommends, they seek good insurance from either State Farm, Allstate, or Progressive insurance companies. These companies will provide contractors with \$1 million dollars in good general liability coverage with **no exclusions**.

Nominating Committee — A Council of Condos Election Committee was formed to evaluate and provide candidates for officers for our organization within Heritage Hills Condominiums. Jack Mattes, Betty Morales, and Renee Celentano agreed to serve and presented a slate of officers without any additional candidates. Therefore, the Secretary moved to cast one vote for the slate. The officers will begin their term at the May meeting. Officers are:

Louise Squitieri, President Terry Clifford, Vice President Dorinda Haskell, Treasurer Linda Grassia, Secretary

Willow Wood Gun Club — Condo 21 President presented updated information on the Willow Wood Gun Club expansion now before the Carmel Town Planning Board. Several Condo presidents, Society Board members, the Somers Town Supervisor, Somers Land Trust members, and other property owners gathered to discuss legal remedies to prevent the expansion and to mitigate environmental impact of their activities. The initial outlay of \$5000 would be required for an attorney to gather information. Further litigation could cost upwards of \$15,000 dollars.

The "Council of Condos" is not incorporated and therefore cannot bring legal action. The question then becomes which condos will contribute, who would hold the funds, and which entity or condo will be named for the legal action. The Gun Club could counter sue whoever brought the legal action causing further monetary hardship. The Town of Somers is also involved with this issue and may present further discussion and/or legal action with the Gun Club on behalf of the Somers Land Trust's environmental issues. These questions and other concerns leave Heritage Hills Condominiums in a quandary with little recourse.

The next meeting of the "Council of Condos" is Wednesday, June 21 at 7 pm at the Activities Center. We hope to see a Condo Board member or representative from every Condo in attendance. Your input is important to our organization.



ROUNDTABLE SOMERS SCHOOLS BUDGET DISCUSSION

As the fairly new Heritage Hills 10-A-Men's Club President I have been invited to participate in the six-person panel on the yet to be voted on 2023/2024 Somers Schools Budget.

Amanda Bergin of the Somers Schools had been newly assigned as the liaison to set up this yearly meeting including Superintendent Raymond Blanch, his Assistant, Chris Platania, Councilman Anthony Cirieco, Tom Newman of Somers Education Fund, Brian Schnapper PTA, and myself as a Heritage Hills resident.

I had prepared for this meeting by viewing the 5-minute budget video Amanda sent me, reading the full-page Somers Record public notice ads re what the propositions and who the candidates are. All four candidates were invited to present at the 10-A-Men. And Dr. Blanch had spoken and will again talk at the 10-A-Men before the vote.

As a retired State employee, whose son attended PEARLS in Yonkers, I was always interested and involved in government and school activities and local youth sports clubs. As my son, now at 34 years old, still says, "Dad, you read everything."

The proposed budget, per the SCSD mailing and the notices and news articles would raise the average Townhouse, Condo Unit yearly cost by approximately \$70.

Dr. Blanch explained, with frequent additional details provided by Chris Platania, about the student enrollment, present and future anticipated numbers.

There are approximately 170 eligible Universal Pre-K children in Somers. Next year the lottery will provide 84 positions to be covered by 100% state funding. This funding by the state is expected to increase thus increasing the number of available seats in the future.

Special Education was discussed at length and the differences of opinion on this very sensitive topic was discussed. One in five students in Somers receive some type of additional instructional help. Many of us have children or friends who have greatly benefitted from this help.

Facilities, costs, purchase contracts and inflation impacts, along with tax certiorari, were reviewed with Councilman Cirieco leading some of the discussion of potential impacts regarding the Old IBM and Pepsi properties. There is a partial reserve fund as per Dr. Blanch to ameliorate any refunds that may be ruled in claimants' favor.

As a frequent grandparent user of Reis Park, I see the school busses bringing the school's tennis teams to the Reis courts for practice. Approving the building of tennis courts at SHS would have many benefits, team morale, reduced bus, and driver costs. And an unintended consequence would be more Reis time/ courts for pickleball use.

I enjoyed my opportunity to meet and discuss issues with all.







THE MANY PLEASURES OF GARDENING

Gardening can be a source of enormous pleasure and gratification. Those of us who love to garden do so for many reasons: the satisfaction we get from growing beautiful flowers to adorn our homes or give away; the ability to marvel over the wonders of nature as we observe pollinators at work and the magical evolution of seeds, bulbs, and seedlings into mature plants displaying bursts of color or revealing hints of a bountiful harvest to come; the opportunity to create our own farm-to-table dining experiences without visiting a highly acclaimed restaurant, knowing that food does not come any fresher than when just picked from our gardens to be turned into an extraordinarily flavorful and nourishing meal that very same day; and the ability to escape from every day pressures and temporarily tune out the rest of the world. By their very nature, gardeners must be optimists because they are always planning for the future, eager to try something new or continue to plant their favorite vegetables, herbs, and fruits based on a taste memory from the past.

In addition to those benefits, members of the Heritage Hills Garden Club also enjoy the camaraderie and generosity of fellow gardeners, as we cross paths in the Community Garden, share extra plants, exchange gardening tips, and also mingle at educational and social events. The maximum number of active gardeners is limited by the size of the Community Garden, which currently offers 140 gardening spaces. There is a long waiting list for one of those coveted spots; it still numbers several dozen residents after assigning all available gardens this year.

In addition to working together in a Community Garden, we also make contributions to the larger community. For example, the "seeds" for creation of a first pollinator garden in Meadowlark Park were initially "planted" by the Garden Club in late 2021. That concept came to fruition during 2022 with the establishment of a new garden at the top of the hill above the children's playground designed and planted by the Garden Club's enthusiastic Native Pollinator Garden group. Meadowlark Park now features three additional pollinator gardens created by the Garden Club, each with a slightly different focus.

The Garden Club also sponsors an outreach program for the purpose of sharing fresh produce with members of the larger Somers community who may have limited access to healthy foods. This program began many years ago and has continued to evolve under the dedicated leadership of a Food Pantry Committee. Each week from late June to late September, members of the Garden Club are asked to donate from their individual gardens any excess produce they are willing to share. We often grow more than we can eat by ourselves; collecting a little bit of excess produce from many gardeners can add up to a generous weekly donation. Members of the Food Pantry Committee also manage a garden that is planted solely for the purpose of raising crops for donation. Last year, the Garden Club donated over 200 pounds of fresh produce to the food pantries operated by the Community Center of Northern Westchester in Katonah and St. Luke's Church in Somers. These donations included tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers, eggplant, squash, cabbage, lettuces, beans, carrots, butternut squash, beets, herbs, and even some colorful flowers. It is a great way to serve our community and extend our gardening activities beyond the fence!





1/8 tsp cloves

salt and pepper to taste

Combine all ingredients in a large saucepan. Bring to a boil, reduce heat to a low simmer and cover.

Cook, covered, for 90 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add more water if needed.

Season to taste with salt and pepper, serve warm.
